A Note From Your Pastor...

Dear friends in Christ,

Lately you have probably been hearing about Pope Francis' recent Apostolic Exhortation entitled *Amoris Laetitia* (Latin for "The Joy of Love"). **What content** is actually contained in this most recent document will be discussed at another time in this forum; but this week I'd like to first clarify **what kind of document** *Amoris Laetitia* is.

Because the Pope is the legitimate and living successor of St. Peter to whom Our Blessed Lord entrusted the pastoral leadership of the Church (see Matthew 16:16-19), he has been entrusted with genuine authority for the good, protection and growth of the Church. The "weight" of authority behind a teaching of the Pope depends on the dogmatic history of the teaching and what the intention of the Supreme Pontiff is. In other words, there are several *degrees of authority* that papal documents hold. Some of teachings are "of the faith" (*de fide*), requiring the assent of Catholics because of the Church's obligation to pass along what Almighty God has revealed. Examples of *de fide* teachings include those solemnly defined, such as the divinity of Christ, or the Immaculate Conception of Mary. There are also *de fide* teachings that have been taught always and everywhere, even if not solemnly declared, such as the evil of certain sins such as abortion or adultery.

Public addresses and documents of the Pope may also contain teachings which come from the common teaching of the Church, but which cannot yet be said to be *de fide*. Even so, these documents can bring new insights, applications and explanations of the Faith, for the sake of the unity and consistency of the Faith given by Christ to the Church, to St. Peter and his successors.

Papal addresses and documents fall into certain categories with degrees of authority relative to each other. The following is a list those categories, beginning with those of the highest weight:

<u>Motu Proprio</u> – A document issued *Motu Proprio* is from the Pope on his own initiative, and not in response to a request or at the initiative of others. Its determinations carry the full force of papal authority.

<u>Apostolic Constitution</u> – These includes solemn Magisterial (or teaching) acts of the Pope. The Pope also uses Apostolic Constitutions to erect dioceses, changing the rules for a papal election, etc.

<u>Encyclical</u> – These are general letters expressing the mind of the Pope, generally on matters of faith and morals. Encyclicals are generally sent to the entire Church or they can be to a particular church or people – Pope Pius XI's encyclical to the German people condemning racism, *Mit brennenden sorge*, would be an example.

<u>Apostolic Letter</u> – Apostolic Letters are of less solemn authority than an encyclical, they may be written on a particular matter of doctrine. They may also announce the decision of a pope to declaring a person Venerable (heroic virtue) or naming a church building a basilica.

<u>Apostolic Exhortation</u> – This category of document is what a pope uses to communicate to the Church the conclusions he has reached after consideration of the recommendations of a Synod of Bishops.

<u>Common Declaration</u> – These are joint statements made by the Holy Father and another religious leader concerning a common understanding of some teaching.

Homily - The homilies of the Pope at Mass.

General Audience – These are opportunities for the people to hear and/or greet the Holy Father in a large public manner, often on Wednesdays in St. Peter's Square. The discourses at these Audiences are typically used to develop a theme over a long period.

<u>Private Audience</u> - The Pope also holds private audiences with individuals and groups. During private audiences, the pope speaks on a particular subject to particular individuals.

Please notice that off the cuff comments made by the Pope during an interview on an airplane are not listed above.
