<u>SELF STUDY RESULTS</u> St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic School recently went through its Self-Study, which is required from the Diocese of Jefferson City every six years. It is an evaluation of our school where a visiting team comprised of three principals and one teacher goes through all of our documents and checks out the standards that go along with the evaluation process. The visiting team spent three days evaluating our school. This process is needed for our school to remain accredited. We want to first share the introduction of the visiting team's final report:

The visiting team found in St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic School community an inviting spirit of faith and hospitality from the entire parish and school community. The entire school community reflected a welcoming, family-oriented environment. It is evident that the school community lives out its mission on a daily basis.

A broad cross section of the school community was involved in the self-study process and honestly evaluated St. Thomas the Apostle Catholic School. The visiting team noted that the school improvement process reflects dedication to providing quality Catholic education to the local community and surrounding area.

Interest in the process of school improvement was evident in the openness of the pastor, administration, faculty, staff, students and parents. The school improvement committee has an excellent opportunity to use the process as a vehicle for growth.

We now want to share the strengths for each of the eleven standards over the next three weeks. We will put down the strengths that the committees came up with in their evaluation, which were affirmed by the visiting team. We will also share the visiting teams' additional strengths for each standard.

#### Standard I: Mission and Philosophy

- The mission statement is a concise statement which incorporates Christian values and principles with children's education
- The mission statement can be easily remembered and recited by staff and students.
- The mission statement and philosophy are displayed prominently in each classroom.
- The philosophy is consistent in the Christian belief which reflects a desire for children to learn, grow and develop.
- The students and staff recite the mission statement every morning.

#### **Standard II: Climate**

- The community is very welcoming to new families, and the school is a large part of the welcome feeling because of the interaction with parents, students, teachers and staff members.
- When individuals outside of the school come in to present or talk with students, they consistently say how respectful the children are.
- The school is always open to listen if there are ideas on how to improve upon curriculum, activities or usage of school time.
- The children take pride in their Catholic religion and bring that excitement home to integrate into their families.
- The school is a clean, well-kept environment that is always showcasing the activities and projects of the students.
- The school provides hands-on activities to assist children in their education.
- The small size of the school creates a larger awareness among faculty and staff, which allows for the problems of children to be recognized and addressed when necessary.
- The students exhibit pride in the school and appear happy.
- A strong sense of Catholic identity is present.

#### Standard III: Leadership

- Administrator has a diverse background, which helps him relate well to others and understand many aspects of situations and solutions.
- Administrator has good interpersonal relationships with students and staff.
- Advisory Board includes members of the community and parish along with school families.
- Administrator communicates openly and effectively with faculty, staff and parents.
- There is a positive working relationship between administrator and pastor.
- The parish priest is supportive and actively involved with the school.

#### Standard IV: Personnel

- Faculty and staff are committed to the philosophy and goals of the school.
- Faculty and staff encourage students to read more and students are rewarded for reaching their goals.
- Participation in staff development activities is strongly encouraged and funding is available.
- Faculty and staff are supportive of one another and have formed a spirit of collaboration.
- The faculty and staff are dedicated to the well-being of the students.
