ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE SESQUICENTENNIAL PLANNING MEETING MINUTES

February 12th, 2016 6:45 PM

Attendees: Fr. Jeremy Secrist, Janet Lueckenhoff, Lauri Luebbering, Tom Backes, Roseanne Boessen, William Boessen, Bill Lueckenhoff, Brian Luebbering

Father Secrist began the meeting with a prayer. (*notes continued on next page*)

Topics of Discussion -

As noted in our parish directory two years ago, St. Thomas the Apostle Parish will be celebrating our sesquicentennial in 2019. The date is 150 years from the time the parish was canonically erected by Father Helias in 1869. We need to start planning the activities since it (*notes continue*)

is only three years away. The Parish Council has been discussing this agenda for awhile. The group brainstormed ideas. Some in the parish have expressed the celebration should not be over burdensome for parishioners. The following ideas were discussed.

Quilt - For the last celebration, the parish made a quilt. Each parishioner had a signed block. The quilt is in the rectory. It would be great to do another quilt. We need to discuss this idea with the quilters.

Keepsake - For the last celebration, several keepsake items were made. Bill Boessen brought examples of the parish's decorative ash tray, buttons, and a coin.

Parade/historical day - Roseanne suggested blocking off part of the town for a parade and vendors for food, historical items, historical demonstrations, old time cars, old time tractors, etc. We would have cross cut saw competitions, adult pedal tractor pulls, nail hammering competitions. Many parishioners have antiques that can be put on display.

Parish Meal and Mass - The group discussed splitting the events during the year. The Bishop would celebrate Mass with the parish. We would have a catered meal and a dance in the evening. A historian could speak at the meal. This event would be separate from the day of the parade and focused on the parishioners. The other event would be open to the public with the vendors providing food booths.

Action Items: - Father would research what month the parish was canonically erected so we can try to arrange for the Mass celebration for the same month. Tom would check on pricing and logistics for a catered meal.

History Book - Bill Boessen and Fr. Secrist showed examples of other parish's centennial books. This activity takes a team of people to complete and needs to start right away. An alternative could be a history calendar. Being such a monumental event, the group felt a book was the most fitting. Do we start from 1974, after the last book was published? Bill Boessen offered several suggestions for chapters within the book and how to tell the story. The group discussed who may be able to help write the book. We need all parishioners to provide input and photos.

Action Items: - Lauri would contact some suggested people to see if they could help with the book. Bill Boessen would type up his book outline and send it to the group.

Signs/Banners - For the last celebration, a banner hung across Route B. It would be nice to do that again, either for just that year or maybe something permanent. Long banners catch a lot of wind. The small banners fastened to the light poles would work better. What about two larger signs? Place them at both ends of town.

Action Items: Father was checking on pricing. Lauri had family that makes signs so she would also check with them.

Shirts: just like the school, we could have sesquicentennial shirts made for the occasion. That could help us raise funds to offset the cost of a catered meal. We could have a design contest.

Display Case: There is room for a display case for showing many of the items from the parish.

Float Trip: Would parishioners enjoy a float trip on the Osage since so many families enjoy that kind of activity?

In addition to planning activities for the sesquicentennial, what kind of upgrades would we like to get done before the celebration? The group agreed the pews needed to be worked on. Father Secrist said fixing the Pfeffer pipe organ is already in the works. What about the interior walls, like the water marks. Father Secrist said tuck pointing the exterior of the church needs to be done before the walls could be addressed. Some of the leaks were addressed by the bell tower and the chimney, but the rest of the church still needs tuck pointing. The group discussed the carpeting which is several years old already, but has held up well. It would be nice to have nicer platforms for the Mary and Joseph statues. It should match the wood of the new altar. An even nicer additional would be side altars.

The group scheduled the next meeting for March 18th at 6:45. Father Secrist ended the meeting with a prayer.
