

Attendees: Fr. Jeremy Secrist, Roseanne Boessen, William Boessen, Brian Luebbering, Janet Heckemeyer Fr Secrist began the meeting with a prayer.

Previous Action Items:

Father was checking on pricing for a sign/banner. Sarah Luebbert said she would help design a banner. No update.

Father would research what month the parish was canonically erected so we can try to arrange for the Mass celebration for the same month. Father proposed a new date, other than July 7th, for the parish celebration. *Item closed*.

Tom would check on pricing and logistics for a catered meal. No update.

Jennifer would check with the quilters to determine how to organize/design a quilt. No update.

Gather lessons learned, information about souvenirs, vendor details from other parishes. Roseanne - Westphalia, Jennifer - Rich Fountain, Laurie - Frankenstein, Janet - St. Elizabeth. Update - Roseanne followed up with St. Joseph Parish. See details below. Roseanne will put a note in the bulletin asking for feedback from parishioners on the best Saturday in September or October to hold the public celebration. *Item closed.* See details below.

Father will have flyers made for the picnic. Update: Flyers were handed out at the picnic. Additional flyers are still available for handing out at future events. *Item closed*.

Roseanne and Laurie would try to develop a form for gathering individual families information. Laurie would use Bill's list to contact military families about filling out the military form. Update: Roseanne sent via email a sample form to the group for comment. *Item closed.*

Topics of Discussion:

Logo Design. Roseanne showed the group an example of a logo she created. It had a picture of the church with a banner across the top. The group will wait for additional examples to choose from.

<u>Dates for parish celebrations:</u>

A new date was tentatively set for the parishioner only celebration, June 30th, 2019. Father proposed the public celebration be called, "St. Thomas Homecoming". Roseanne has been watching the dates for local events in September and October. The best time appears to be late September. The group tentative set September 28th, 2019 for the St. Thomas Homecoming.

Lessons Learned from other Parishes

Roseanne gathered information from St. Joseph Parish's 175th anniversary celebrated in 2010. They had a one day event with artisan demonstrations, displays, and music stages all along Main Street in Westphalia. The Historical Society provided the souvenirs. They had a section added in the News Tribune. Roseanne provided the group with copies of St. Joseph materials, including a list of the vendors and equipment needed for their celebration. Roseanne provided the group a rough sketch of a possible parade route, activities, and parking for the St. Thomas Homecoming. The group would wait for the lessons learned information from the rest of the parishes.

History Book

Bill noted the military section is going well, with many families submitted information to Marilyn Herigon. Bill tested Roseanne's family form on a few families. He modified the form to let families prioritize which subject they wanted most in the book, since space is limited.
