### **LETTER FROM THE BISHOP:**

Catholic Home Missions Appeal April 28-29, 2018

Dear Friends in Christ,

In our country, there is an urgency for sharing the message of Christ and the beauty of the Church. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal (CHMA) on April 28-29 is one important way in which we can respond. This appeal supports U.S. mission dioceses that do not have the resources to meet the basic pastoral needs of their people.

The mountainous, isolating geography of the Diocese of Pueblo has shaped the attitude of pastors and parishioners alike. They tend to be highly independent. This has served them well, since only 44 priests and 45 deacons are available to serve the needs of over 64,000 Catholics.

The diocese is rural, covering the entire southern half of Colorado. With your support of CHMA, the Diocese of Pueblo offers lay ministry training programs. Graduates assist pastors serving the most isolated parishes in everything from catechesis to visiting the sick and elderly.



#### FROM THE WRITINGS OF POPE BENEDICT XVI ON THE LITURGY OF THE CHURCH:

"(There is) the need to avoid any antithesis between the *ars celebrandi*, the art of proper celebration, and the full, active and fruitful participation of all the faithful. The primary way to foster the participation of the People of God in the sacred rite is the proper celebration of the rite itself. The *ars celebrandi* is the best way to ensure their *actuosa participatio*. The *ars celebrandi* is the fruit of faithful adherence to the liturgical norms in all their richness; indeed, for two thousand years this way of celebrating has sustained the faith life of all believers, called to take part in the celebration as the People of God, a royal priesthood, a holy nation (1 Peter 2:4-5, 9). Sacramentum Caritatis

Ars celebrandi (the "art of celebrating") involves:

- 1. Fidelity to the texts and rubrics of the Church
- 2. Prayerful understanding of the liturgical texts, feasts and seasons
- 3. Reverent sense of the ministers and assembly engaging in an exchange, which is the dialogue of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit
- 4. Proper preparation for celebrating the liturgy
