PASTORS MEDITATION: Third Sunday of Easter. JOURNEYING WITH JESUS. (Acts 2:14, 22-33 1 Pt 1:17-21, Lk 24:13-35) Jesus is to be found today in the midst of his Church in the breaking of the bread. Our Scripture lessons for today have one common, encouraging theme: No matter what happens in our lives, the risen Jesus is always with us. God is always near to those who seek Him and want to live in His presence, doing His will. The first reading, from Acts, taken from the beginning of Peter's first public proclamation about Jesus, tells us how God raised Jesus from death, thus fulfilling the Messianic prophecies about the promised descendant of David. The Refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 16), has us singing, "Lord, You will show us the path of Life." In the second reading, Peter exhorts the early Christians to place their Faith and Hope in God Who has saved them through the precious Blood of His Son and Who has raised Jesus from the dead. The Emmaus incident described in today's Gospel shows us a God who will not abandon us when we are hurt and disappointed. The message of today's Scripture readings is that the followers of Jesus are to maintain contact with their Risen Lord through prayer, the Eucharist, and the Bible. The readings also remind us that our belief in Jesus' presence in the consecrated Bread and Wine should help us to better understand his presence in the Bible and in the believing and worshipping community. Putting the two appearances to the Emmaus disciples and to Peter, together, it is clear that the risen Jesus wanted Peter to act as spokesman for him, and that the faithful who seek to follow Jesus should seek his company in prayer, the Eucharist, and the Bible under the direction of Peter and his successors. Jesus meets us on our Emmaus Road. The risen Lord meets us on the road to our Emmaus, both in the ordinary experiences of our lives, and in the places to which we retreat when life is too much for us. We, too, have hopes and dreams about better health, healing, financial security and better family relationships. These often shatter. The story promises us, however, that Jesus will come to us in unfamiliar guises to support and strengthen us when we least expect the risen Lord. Emmaus moments come to us when we meet the risen Christ on our life's journey through rough We meet Jesus on a daily basis in our life's journey. The Church instructs us to hear Jesus on a daily basis through prayer, through the faithful reading of, and meditation on, the Bible, through our experience of Jesus as we participate in the Eucharistic celebration in which the risen Lord gives us Himself as our spiritual Food and Drink, through our personal and family prayers, and through our family meals. When we meet Jesus in the Eucharist and through the Word of God, we commune with him in prayer, and thus renew our relationship of mutual loving service. These meetings enable us to encounter the risen Jesus living in all the people we meet and, in them, to offer our Lord humble, loving, selfless service. Do our hearts burn when we listen to the risen Lord in the Bible? Christ comes to us most clearly in the Word. Vatican II (Dei Verbum 21) tells us that Jesus is to be equally venerated in the Eucharist and in the Bible. Therefore, we need to study the Bible, learn the Bible, pray with the Bible, memorize the Bible, meditate on the word of God with burning zeal, and practice what the Bible teaches. One way to strengthen our faith is to live the teachings of Jesus more faithfully. Have a blessed week! Fr. Leonard Mukiibi

#### St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Pastoral Council March Meeting - March 30, 2023

Call the meeting to order, Father led the Our Father.

Principals Notes: Shane read through the notes. Major events that have taken place or that are going to take place - State Archery, Self Study, Spelling Bee, spring pictures, Easter break, STL Cardinals game, Home and School meeting, Sketch Day, Vocation Day, NET retreat, field trip to the zoo, field day, and 8th grade graduation.

Financial Report - They have not met.

Worship - There is a meeting coming up.

Social: Vocation Committee - We need someone to start this. There will be meetings in Jefferson City. There is someone within the Diocese that will help coordinate.

- The Ham breakfast made a gross profit of \$16,100 and a net profit of \$8,884. Jan Heckemeyer said there might be a few more minor bills to pay yet from the breakfast.
- Elections for the New Parish Council Members are coming up. Debbie will put an announcement in the bulletin stating that we are looking for candidates to run. Andi and Dunja will start reaching out to people if we do not hear from anyone in the next couple weeks. We are looking for 4 members. Debbie Strope, Sarah Luebbert, Mark Luebbering, and Bob Schellman are all going off the council in May. The new members will start in July.
- Catholic Charities Update Andi Reynolds has signed up for this. She is still waiting to hear more about it from the Diocese.
- Celebration of New Members We set this for April 23. It will be right after Mass at 10. We will have donuts and possibly drinks.

Admin: The admin group is still working on getting the part time position ready to be posted.

- The rectory renovation is almost finished. Be watching in the bulletin for the selling of the old appliances from the Rectory. If no one is interested, then the items are going to Habitat for Humanity. A new stove and dishwasher were donated. Mark is thinking that he will ask the finance committee to purchase a new refrigerator for the kitchen.
- The new AC & heating unit is going to be installed in the Church sometime between the middle of April & May. This will take about 2
  weeks.
- We got the new lawn mower for the year. The owner of Elite Turf has volunteered to cut the grounds around the Church. Mark wants
  to keep the rotation of the grass cutters just in case the owner of Elite Turf can not make it one week. Then he can call the lead for
  that week and the grass cutting rotation can just continue.
- The steam table was installed and worked great for the Ham Breakfast and Fish Fry.
- The shut off valves for the ovens were installed last weekend.

Pastors report: Father touched base on the renovation of his house.

- Father talked about the Lenten season. Please make sure to go to confession.
- The Cathedral is almost completed.
- We need to get a meeting set for the new stewardship model.

New Business: Stewardship group

- We have 8 volunteers so far from different committees within the parish. No one has signed up for the parish yet. The volunteers have all been from other committees. (ex. PPC, finance, School Advisory, PSR, Ladies Auxiliary, KofC) Shane is going to get a meeting set up so that the committee can start working on this.
- Directory: Shane is going to contact the company. We are going to plan on getting pictures taken the second week of January.
- Self study: The Self Study took place. This happens every 6 years. They had good things to say about the school. There are a few
  minor changes that need to be corrected. The school is going to work on those.

Varia: A Memorial Mass will take place at the cemetery this year on Memorial Day. It will be at 9 am. If it rains, then the Mass will be at Church. They are going to talk about this at the April Worship meeting.

- Bob Schellmam suggested that we get the students to lead the rosary before the weekday Mass. He also suggested that the kids
  come in and say a little prayer when they genuflect.
- The council talked about vehicles parking on the parish lots for a long period of time. If we notice this happening, then law
  enforcement will be called.
- Mark would like to get gravel put in the ditch along route B. The ditch is steep and hard to cut grass on. Jacob or Mark are going to talk to the MoDot right away leader to discuss a solution.
