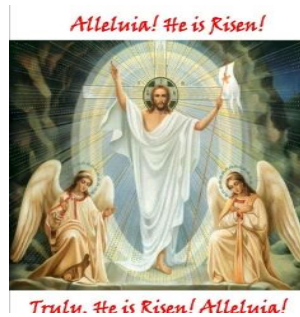

BISHOP MCKNIGHT'S APRIL PRAYER INTENTION: Let us pray for a renewed understanding of our baptismal dignity as sons and daughters of God the Father, and a commitment to living in peace with our sisters and brothers in Christ.

PASTORS MEDITATION: EASTER SUNDAY: THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD (AA. 10:34a, 37-43; Col. 3:1-4 OR 1Cor. 5:6b-8; Jn. 20:1-9) Alleluia! Christ is risen Alleluia! I congratulate you all upon dedicating yourselves to God by your intensive prayer, fasting and doing works of mercy and charity during the past six weeks. Thanks for suffering together with Jesus, dying with him and now rising with Him, He has Risen Alleluia! Easter is the greatest and the most important feast in the Church for three reasons:

1) The Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith. It is the greatest of the miracles, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: *"If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain" (1 Cor 15:14). "Jesus is Lord, He is Risen!"* (Rom 10:9), was the central theme of the *kerygma* or "preaching", of the apostles, because Jesus had prophesied His Resurrection as a sign of His Divinity: 2) Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: *"I am the Resurrection and the Life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies" (Jn 11:25-26).* 3) Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows, and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living. It is our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven that gives meaning to our personal as well as our communal prayer, strength to fight against temptations, and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears.

Now, the resurrection of Christ brings us further and transforms us even more. Christ's glorified presence standing before us and living within us shows us that we are all much more than we see ourselves to be and show to others. We have a depth, purpose, and essence that go way beyond the superficial treasures of our existence to the very core of who we are. Slowly but surely, we are being given opportunities by God to be transformed more and more into Christ. This whole process will find final completion when Christ comes again in time and gathers all things and all people to himself. Then the fullness of truth will be realized.

Dear friends let us therefore live the lives of "Resurrection people": Easter gives us the joyful message that we are a "Resurrection people." This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, evil habits, dangerous addictions, despair, discouragement or doubts. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the living Presence of the Risen Lord in all the events of our lives and amid the boredom, suffering, pain, and tensions of our day-to-day life.

We need to live aware of the presence of the Risen Lord with us. Our awareness of the all-pervading presence of the Risen Lord in and around us, and the strong conviction of our own coming resurrection, help us to *control our thoughts, desires, words and behavior.* This salutary thought inspires us to *honor our bodies, keeping them holy,* pure, and free from evil habits and addictions. Our conviction about the presence of the Risen Lord in our neighbors and in all those with whom we come into contact should encourage us to respect them, and to render them loving, humble and selfless service.

We need to radiate the Risen Lord all around us: We are called to be transparent Christians, showing others through our lives the love, mercy, compassion, and the spirit of self-sacrificing service lived by the Risen Jesus dwelling in our hearts.

We need to share in the power of the Risen Lord: Let us recall that, each time we try to practice Christian charity, mercy and forgiveness and each time we fight against temptations, we share in the Resurrection of Jesus.

May the Risen Lord be a living experience to you pervading every area of your life, blessing you, strengthening you, inspiring you, guiding you and supporting you in your faith life. ***Have a blessed week! Fr. Leonard Mukibi***

PPC Goal: Develop a more inclusive sense of community in our Parish by encouraging the growth of our relationships with each other and with God.

Members Present: Jackie Prenger, Theresa Veit, Alan Reinkemeyer, Barb Graessle, Brian Luebbering, Mark Luebbering, Debbie Strope, Jackie Prenger, Ryan Wieberg, Bob Schellman, Jan Carter and Father Leonard Mukiibi. **Not Present:** Kathy Graessle, Sarah Luebbert, and Curt Goeller

The meeting was opened at 7:00 pm with a prayer by Father Leonard.

Principal's Report (Leroy) MoNASP State Archery Tournament was held March 18-20 in Branson. Our students did well. Thanks to our archers and coaches.

- Report cards were sent home on March 22.
- Easter break in April 1, 2 and 5 with no school on those days.
- First Holy Communion is Sunday, April 18th at 1:00 pm.
- The Diocesan Sketch day which was planned for April 20th has been cancelled.
- The Diocesan Vocation day for 6th graders in May 5th and it looks like it will be virtual.
- We are still working on what our Field Day will look like and it likely to not include parents.
- 8th grade Graduation is scheduled for Tuesday, May 18th at 7:00 pm. There will be more details later. The last day of school is May 19th.
- Preschool graduation will be held on the last day of school at 8:30 am. Only 2 people per candidate will be allowed to come into the gym for this event.
- The school received a donation of \$10,000 from an anonymous donor. It has been used to purchase white boards for all the classes. Most of the money will be used for things teachers need or want for their classrooms. \$3500 will be used for a new sound system in the gym with installation beginning on March 25.

Financial Committee Report: Giving is down about 5 or 6%. We are still in good financial shape for this year.

Worship/Christian Education: A grant is being looked at to be used to support FORMED.

All readers, communion ministers etc. have been confirmed for Holy Week.

We may be getting a holy water dispenser with a sensor so you only need to hold out your hand to get holy water to sign yourself. Missalettes will be in the pews now for use during Mass.

Social Concerns:

- The Welcome Handbook is now on-line and at the front of church.
- Lucy Suthoff has greeted the Wickers family who are new to the community.

Administration Report:

- The tuckpointing has been completed. The letters on the school will be put back up.
- The construction on the bell tower is complete. We are waiting on chains to come in to complete the repair of the clock.
- Grass cutting rotation will start soon. Someone has given us a bid on fertilizing that needs to be considered.
- A new stack oven is needed for the kitchen. Mark will get some prices.
- Brian shared an update from the Church Renovation Committee. The presentation about the renovations was done on March 7th but there is lots of work to be done before the renovation begins. More bids have to be obtained for flooring and some other things. Once it begins, it may take up to 4 months. There was a discussion about weddings that are planned and Mass during the construction. More discussion will be held on this. There was also discussion about various options for Mass. Father suggested using St. Cecilia but they would have to agree to that. We are also considering doing a pledge drive to raise money for this project.

Pastor's Report (Father Leonard)

- Father Leonard announced Theresa Veit as the new Parish Administrative Assistant.
- Father also asked for married couples to assist with young couples thinking about marriage, to serve as mentors of sort. There will be training for the couples who volunteer. Two couples have already volunteered.
- Father's phone has been used to request money from parishioners but it is not him but a scam.

New Business

- Elections to the Parish Council will be held in late May. Four people are scheduled to go off the council creating 4 vacancies. Jackie will put something in the bulletin about it and Barb and Jan will make calls to parishioners who might be interested in serving.
- The next meeting is planned for Tuesday, May 25, 2021.
- The meeting adjourned with a prayer and blessing by Father Leonard.
