

#### HISTORIC AWARD TO BE PRESENTED:

Since 1975, the Organ Historical Society has identified specific pipe organs as having historical, cultural, and musical significance by presenting certificates of recognition. The Historic Pipe Organ Awards program is designed in accord with the specific guidelines for conservation and preservation and includes different types of awards, each one distinct in the way it recognizes the historic significance of a pipe organ.


The 1897 J.G. Pfeffer pipe organ at St. Thomas the Apostle Church has been identified by the Organ Historical Society as an instrument of significance and on April 29th, 2018 a historic organ award will be presented to the parish. Among the over 50,000 pipe organs that currently exist in the United States, a few more than 400 have merited this prestigious award (only 13 have been awarded in the State of Missouri).

So what are the general requirements for an Historic Organ Award? A pipe organ must be an example of excellence in organbuilding to receive an award. The specific way excellence is determined in an instrument is up to the judgment of the Historic Organ Awards Committee as it considers both mechanical and tonal properties of the organ in question. An instrument must be in an unaltered state for a period of at least 50 years in order to receive an award.

And so in celebration, a concert for organ and trumpet will be offered on Sunday, April 29 at 4:00 p.m. featuring the noteworthy performers Andrew Risinger and Joel Treybig.

Mr. Risinger currently serves as Organist and Associate Director of Music of West End United Methodist Church, Nashville, and is an adjunct faculty member at Belmont University. In 2007 he was named Organ Curator for the Schermerhorn Symphony Center and serves as primary organist for the Nashville Symphony. As a concert artist he has performed throughout the United States including performances at the National Cathedral in Washington D.C., St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City, and Trinity Church in Boston. Mr. Risinger has also performed as a soloist with the Illinois Symphony as well as the Nashville Symphony. His performances have been heard on National Public Radio broadcasts of Performance Today as well as on Pipedreams.

Dr. Treybig has performed with symphony orchestras, pit orchestras and chamber groups throughout the United States and is an active solo recitalist and clinician who has performed by invitation at diverse venues such as International Trumpet Guild conferences, the Midwest Trumpet Festival, Piccolo Spoleto Festival, Spivey Hall, the Trumpet Festival of the Southeast, and the Victoria Bach Festival. He is a Professor of Music in the Belmont University School of Music.
