PASTORS MEDITATION: EASTER SUNDAY: ALLELLUIA! ALLELLUIA! HE IS NOT HERE HE IS RISEN

In our practical daily life, Easter means experiencing the power of Jesus changing a great tragedy in our lives into a glorious new beginning. Easter is experiencing the risen Lord at work in our own lives The disciples of Jesus before the great tragedy of good Friday, Jesus was the person who gave meaning to their lives, they had pledged their lives to Jesus, they had put their dreams in Jesus, they had pinned their hopes in Jesus, then came good Friday, all pledges, all dreams, all hopes got smashed into a million pieces, all their hopes, dreams, their very life died with Jesus on the cross. When the sun went down on Good Friday, they too were buried in the tomb with Jesus, it was all over. Then it happened as the sun rose on Easter morning, Jesus rose and appeared to his disciples, he was more radiant and more fully alive than they had ever seen him before. At that moment the power of Easter began to work in the lives of his disciples, suddenly they were transformed from a band of despairing men and women into a brigade of daring missionaries. At the command of Jesus they set out to carry the news of Easter to the four corners of the earth, they preached the good news and the power of Easter began to work in the lives of the people, beautiful things began to happen, despair gave way to hope, darkness gave way to light, hatred gave way to love, sorrow gave way to joy, in other words, everywhere the disciples preached the power of the risen Lord. Easter began to work miracles in people's lives. And those miracles haven't stopped yet, they continue to happen. Therefore, friends we are invited to open our hearts to the risen Jesus and let him do for us what he did for his disciples and the people to whom they preached after the first Easter. We need to let Jesus help us love again after we have had our love rejected by someone, we invited to let Jesus help us trust again after we have had our trust betrayed by others, we are invited to hope again after we have watched our hopes die, we are invited to let Jesus wipe our tears and then pick up our pieces and start all over again after some great tragedy. This is what Easter is all about, Jesus is now in our midst to work miracles if we let him to, its good news that nothing now can defeat us anymore, it's good news that Jesus triumphed and so we will triumph as well if we open our hearts to him. This is what we celebrate on this great birthday of our Christian faith. These days we live in a culture of fear, nurtured by the social media that conduct an up-to-the minute feeding frenzy on every horror in our world, where death seems more victorious that life. Today's gospel talks of two fears: the fear of the guards, which makes them like corpses, they rush to deliver a false message to the chief priests, they resist faith and joy. Sometimes fear blinds people from the light and the truth. The fear of the women at the words of the angel, but their fear is transformed into joy, they feel a mysterious touch of God in their lives in a unique way. The proclamation of Easter is not simply a happy ending to a tragic story. It captures suffering and death transformed into life, the women were seeking Jesus the crucified one and found out that death could not hold him, they became the heralds of the culture of love and joy in the face of death. Death is not the meaningless end of life but a door to the fullness of life with the risen Christ who in his transformed humanity remains one Have a blessed week! Fr. Leonard Mukiibi
