BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS TREE

The origins of the Christmas tree are found in the medieval plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, who is the Light of the world. According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up before Christmas and remains in place until at least the Solemnity of Epiphany, or in some parts of the world, even until the Feast of the Presentation. In the home, the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent, perhaps in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree. May the light ad cheer it gives be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts. May all who delight in this tree come to the knowledge and joy of salvation. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.

THE "O ANTIPHONS" OF ADVENT

The Roman Church has been singing the "O" Antiphons since the earliest centuries; the 6th century writer Boethius mentions them. They are the antiphons that accompany the *Magnificat*, the great prayer of Mary in Luke 1:46-55, during Vespers (Evening Prayer) from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfillment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

The first letters of each of the titles in Latin, starting with the last and working back to the first will spell: ERO CRAS... "I will be tomorrow". The Latin versions of each of the titles of the Messiah are: Sapientia (Wisdom), Adonai (Lord), Radix (Root), Clavis (Key), Oriens (Dawn), Rex (King), and Emmanuel (Emmanuel).

The song "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" is simply a reworking of the seven O Antiphons. When you sing it, you are joining yourself to a vast throng of Christians stretching back across centuries and spanning the whole of the earth who prayed as all Christians do, "Come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20)

December 17

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19 O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23 O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

BLESSING OF CHRISTMAS CRÈCHE

The custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ owes its origin to St. Francis of Assisi, who made the Christmas crèche or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223. The blessing of the Christmas manger or nativity scene may take place on the Vigil of Christmas.

All make the sign of the cross.

Then the leader says: **Our help is in the name of the Lord.** R/. *Who made heaven and earth.* A text of sacred Scripture may be read, for example, Luke 2:1-14.

The leader prays: God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation You have made manifest your love: when our need for a Savior was great You sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary. To our lives He brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love. Lord, bless all who look upon this manger; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Savior of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. R/. Amen.
