BISHOP MCKNIGHT'S JANUARY PRAYER INTENTION: For those seeking employment, that through the intercession of St. Joseph the Worker, they may find dignified work in supporting themselves and their family.

UPDATED DECREE FROM BISHOP MCKNIGHT:

Whereas the case numbers of COVID-19 infections remain at their highest levels for many counties of Mid-Missouri; and
Whereas the common good demands that the public health requirements and recommendations of the state are to be observed whenever possible; and

Whereas the Presbyteral Council has provided their advice with regard to the ongoing reality of the pandemic; and

Whereas the current DECREE governing pastoral activities during the pandemic expires on the 27th day of November 2020;

I therefore declare, as the diocesan bishop, the following:

1. **All dispensations, obligations and guidance of the previous DECREE of 21 August 2020**, originally effective until 27 November 2020, shall now be extended until further notice.
2. All the faithful of the Diocese of Jefferson City, and those who are present in the territory of the diocese, are therefore dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass in person on Sundays and holy days of obligation until further notice, provided that for days of precept they do one of the following:
 - o Prayerfully participate in the Sunday or holy day of obligation Mass live streamed from their parish church or chapel, the Cathedral, the Vatican, or of any Mass of the day celebrated in communion with the Roman Catholic Church.
 - o Prayerfully read and meditate on the readings of the Mass for the Sunday or holy day of obligation, and recite the rosary or Divine Mercy chaplet.
 - o The faithful still have the obligation to keep the Lord's Day holy and "to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2185)
3. Parishes are highly encouraged to live stream Masses for Sundays and holy days of obligation to maintain a pastoral connection with their parishioners during and after the pandemic.
4. Celebrations of penance services, as well as other seasonal services that entail extra gatherings of the faithful apart from Mass, are to be avoided. Instead, parish priests are asked to make themselves more available, even on a daily basis during the last week of Advent, to hear the confessions of the faithful.
5. Whenever possible, the faithful should present themselves to their parish priest for the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick before they depart for the hospital. Because of pandemic protocols at hospitals throughout the diocese, priests may not have access to patients at the hospital.
6. The vigil Mass for the Solemnity of the Nativity of the Lord [Christmas] on 24 December 2020 may be celebrated as early as 3 pm to accommodate an ample Mass schedule for social distancing requirements. Whenever possible, every active priest of the diocese shall celebrate a vigil Mass of Christmas at 3 pm with the faithful so as to minimize large numbers congregating at the most popular Mass of the season. The allowance for a 3 pm vigil Mass of Christmas is only for this year and not to be presumed for the future.

This decree is effective from 28 November 2020 and until further notice, anything to the contrary notwithstanding.

PASTOR'S MEDITATION: MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR: IMMANUEL, "GOD WITH US."

Names of very many cities don't hold as much meaning for us as that of Bethlehem. The name calls to mind the images of Mary and Joseph bending in loving care of the newborn baby Jesus, of the shepherds looking on in wonder and awe and the of the angels singing their "Glory to God in the highest"

Jesus was made flesh in the womb of Mary and born in Bethlehem (meaning the house of bread) so that he could give us his flesh as our spiritual bread. His birth was the turning point in history. How privileged was Mary to give birth to the child Jesus. How blessed was Joseph to share Mary's joy. How fortunate were the shepherds and the Angels to witness the event. Though Bethlehem took place many centuries ago, its purpose is fulfilled whenever we receive the body of Jesus in communion as our church becomes a new Bethlehem, a house of spiritual bread.

Christmas reveals to us the goodness and love of our God. Christmas is appealing to us because it makes God so close to us; Jesus is indeed Immanuel, "God with us." The Christmas message calls us from selfishness to a renewal of the worship of the one true God, who is worthy of a complete and total dedication.

God not only knew what he wanted, he also knew what he was doing. He was making it clear that he alone was God. He did not have to rely on the mighty armies to conquer evil, he did not have to appeal to philosophical wisdom for spread of his truth, he did not have to rely on any human government to bring about justice and peace, God made his saving power in infant Jesus Christ, an act which appears to be folly in the eyes of the wise of this world. He chose to bring salvation to humankind through the blood of Christ poured out on the cross, an act which seems to be a weakness in the eyes of the powerful of this world. God did what he did for us to attain salvation not by our own human efforts but by his free gift in Jesus Christ. No human wisdom, no human force can be given credit in place of God but praise and worship be given to God for our salvation.

In my country children are mostly anxious looking towards Christmas for the joys and feasting around it, actually it's not meant for the children only but adults too, Christmas is meant for anyone who has faith and humility as Mary was. Mary manifested how profound was her faith and how great was her humility "my spirit finds joy in God my savior, for he has looked upon his servant in her lowliness."

To feel the joy of Christmas we must have the faith to believe that the almighty God himself came into our world in the flesh of an infant. To experience the thrill of Christmas we must accept the awesome paradox, to derive benefit from Christmas we have to receive Jesus Christ as God's special gift to us, to open our arms and embrace him, to let him become a part of our lives, as Mary did. Even if we are mature adults with serious responsibilities we must be humble enough to admit that we need Jesus, that without him we cannot make any sense of our lives or accomplish any worthwhile purpose. All Christmas joys can be ours if we join Mary in saying "my spirit finds joy in God my savior, for he has looked upon his servant in her lowliness."

If Christmas is going to make meaning for us this year, we must try through its celebration to become more like Jesus. Our love, our respect and our concern must spread beyond ourselves, family, companions and friends, the undesirables of this world must have a special claim on us and then we will be like Jesus. **MERRY CHRISTMAS AND HAPPY NEW YEAR!**
