

<u>BISHOP MCKNIGHT MARCH PRAYER INTENTON</u>: For a greater respect for the dignity of all human life; may our Catholic Faith inspire us to recognize all human beings – no matter their age, race, or condition – as our brothers and sisters in the Lord.

PASTORS MEDITATION: FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT [A] JESUS IS THE TRUE LIGHT FOR THE BELIEVERS. (1Sam.

16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a; Eph. 5:8-14; Jn. 9:1-41) The Fourth Sunday of Lent is known as "Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday," expressing the Church's joy in anticipation of the Resurrection of our Lord. Today's readings remind us that it is God Who both gives us proper vision in body as well as in soul and instructs us that we should be constantly on our guard against spiritual blindness.

The first reading, taken from the First Book of Samuel, by describing the anointing of David as the second king of Israel, illustrates how blind we are in our judgments and how much we need God's help. It reminds us that those whom God involves in his saving plans are not necessarily those whom the world perceives as great. St. Paul in the second reading, reminds the Ephesians of their new responsibility as children of light and "to live as children of the light, by producing every kind of goodness and righteousness and truth." In today's Responsorial Psalm, (Ps 23), we celebrate the care of God, our Good Shepherd, who keeps us safe in the darkness of this world. Presenting the miracle of Jesus' giving of sight to a man born blind, today's Gospel teaches us the necessity of being willing to have our eyes opened by Faith and warns us that those who assume they see the truth are often blind, while those who acknowledge their blindness are given clear vision. In this episode, the most unlikely person, namely the beggar born blind, receives the light of Faith in Jesus, while the religion-oriented, law-educated Pharisees remain spiritually blind. To live as a Christian is to see and to grow continually, gaining clearer vision about God, about ourselves and about others. Our Lenten prayers and sacrifices should help to heal our spiritual blindness so that we can look at others, see them as children of God, and love them as our own brothers and sisters, saved by the death and Resurrection of Jesus.

So dear friends we need to allow Jesus to heal our spiritual blindness. We all have blind-spots our lives, in our marriages, our parenting, our work habits and our personalities. We are often blind to the presence of the Triune God dwelling within us and fail to appreciate His presence in others. Even practicing Christians can be blind to the poverty, injustice, and pain around them. Let us remember that Jesus wants to heal our blindness. We need to ask him to remove from us the root causes of our blindness: self-centeredness, greed, anger, hatred, prejudice, jealousy, addiction to evil habits, hardness of heart and the like. Let us pray to God our Father, to help us see Christ more clearly, love him more dearly and follow him more nearly" day by day. We need to get rid of cultural blindness. Our culture also has blind-spots. Often it is blind to things like selfless love, happiness, fidelity with true, committed love in marriage and the value of human life from birth to natural death. Our culture has become anesthetized to the violence and the enormous suffering in the world around us. Let us counteract this cultural blindness as, with His grace, we experience Jesus dwelling within us and within others, through personal prayer, meditative reading of the Bible, and a genuine Sacramental life. *Have a blessed week! The meeting opened at 6:50 with a prayer by Fr. Leonard Mukiibi. Those present were Joanne Schroeder, Emily Libbert, Katy Werdehausen, Shirley Bock, Dusty Stegeman, Norma Jean Libbert, Janice Schanzmeyer, Fr. Leonard. Not in attendance was bookkeeper Doris Stumpe.

Minutes from the last meeting had been previously approved.

Committee Reports

- Building and Grounds: The roof has been replaced. The external sewage issue had been dug out so it is able to drain. There isn't currently a septic system so the council may need to look into that. Father mentioned joining it in with the rectory system. Father also mentioned the door at the sacristy is rotting and needs to be looked into. Parish grounds cleanup will be April 29. The parish is still accepting bids for grass cutting and cleaning. Those will be accepted through March 15. Janice Schanzmeyer has the list of expectations for those jobs. Contracts will need to be drawn up for these jobs along with choosing a start/end date for whoever wins the bids.
- Cemetery: Next meeting is March 13. They will look in if the organization uses the church ID and if Father's name should be on the account.
- Finance: Met in February. There was a discussion about the use of the AJ Schwartz fund and use of this year's funds and the council will be submitting the next request. Dusty also reported on current finances and balances on the accounts.
- Liturgical and Worship: May need help with getting church ready for Easter. Sign-ups will be in the back of the Church for Holy Week mass participation. Joanne put together a calendar of events to help keep the parish council on track for planning purposes moving forward. This list was greatly appreciated by the council.
