**AED'S FOR OUR PARISHES:** Approximately 890 deaths from coronary heart disease occur outside of the hospital or emergency room *every day*. Most of these deaths are due to the sudden loss of heart function or sudden cardiac death. Chances of survival from sudden cardiac death diminish by 7-10% for each minute without immediate CPR or defibrillation. After 10 minutes, resuscitation rarely succeeds. An AED is an electronic device designed to deliver an electric shock to a victim of sudden cardiac arrest. Ventricular fibrillation may be restored to normal rhythm up to 60% of the time if treated promptly with an AED, a procedure called defibrillation. Automated External Defibrillators are portable devices that check the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. **AED's** are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest (SCA).

Because of the length of ambulance response times in this area and in memory of some of our parishioners who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, both St. Thomas the Apostle & St. Cecilia Parishes will soon have AED's on campus.

The AED's are now in place in both parishes: one AED is located at the side entrance of St. Thomas the Apostle church; another is located in the foyer between the school cafeteria and the Parish Center gym; another AED is located in the hallway outside of the St. Thomas bowling alley. An AED is located at the front entrance of St. Cecilia church, outside the restroom.

There will be an AED training session at 7:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 25 in the School Library at St. Thomas the Apostle for all interested parishioners. The AED's were donated in memory of Teresa Kaiser (for St. Thomas the Apostle Church), Joe Luebbering (for St. Thomas the Apostle School) and Leona Fick and Donna Scheulen (for St. Cecilia Parish).



### THOUGHTS ON HOLY WEEK

Holy means "set apart." Christians set apart an entire week - Holy Week - to recall the events surrounding the suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. While we pursue our daily relationship with the Lord through various forms of private prayer, as Catholics the Liturgy of the Church unites us in corporate prayer. The liturgical celebrations of Holy Week, perhaps more than any other, remind us of the richness available to us when we gather together to pray and worship with one another. When we gather for Holy Mass we believe that our souls and voices are raised together in prayer with those of the whole Communion of Saints and the angels in heaven. Our presence in the worshipping assembly becomes the vessel into which God pours His Sacramental grace.

The sacramental aspects of the Church's liturgical prayer can awaken our minds and all of our senses to the reality of the mysteries we celebrate. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (Paragraph 1146) affirms: "As a being at once body and spirit, man expresses and perceives spiritual realities through physical signs and symbols. As a social being, man needs signs and symbols to communicate with others, through language, gestures, and actions. The same holds true for his relationship with God". For us Catholics, the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord are not events that happened in the distant past; they are real in this moment, active in our own lives. We experience this mystery as we relate to one another and to God and as we engage our own physicality.

Consider the many ways we use our bodies, as well as the gifts of creation, in the Masses and prayers of Holy Week: We wave palm branches. The priest uses water to wash the feet of others. We kneel at the proclamation of the Death of the Lord. We touch or kiss the wood of the Cross. Fire, incense, bells, water, oil, and of course, bread and wine, are a veritable symphony for our senses used during the Mother of all Vigils: the Easter Vigil.

The central mystery of our faith is the Incarnation of God. Never is the humanity of Jesus more clearly revealed than on the Cross. As we enter into the mysteries of this coming Holy Week, pray that we may be more closely united to our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ in prayer, in contemplation and in worship.

### THE LITANY OF THE SACRED PASSION

Lord Jesus, at the Last Supper you knew that Judas, one of the Twelve, would betray you.

GOOD LORD, DELIVER US FROM FALSE FRIENDS AND TREACHERY.

Lord Jesus, during the supper, you humbly washed the feet of your disciples.

GOOD LORD, MAKE US MEEK AND HUMBLE OF HEART.

Lord Jesus, at the Last Supper, you gave us the Sacrament of your broken body and outpoured blood. GOOD LORD, WE WORSHIP THE SEAL OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT.

Lord Jesus, you asked your disciples to watch and pray with you in the Garden of Gethsemane.

GOOD LORD, KEEP US AWAKE AND WATCHFUL WITH YOU.

Lord Jesus, at your betrayal and arrest all your friends fled in fear and deserted you.

GOOD LORD, GIVE US COURAGE IN TIME OF TRIAL.

Lord Jesus, you were falsely accused and condemned for speaking the truth before Caiaphas, the high priest.

GOOD LORD, MAY WE SPEAK TRUTH IN THE FACE OF INJUSTICE.

Lord Jesus, in the courtyard of the high priest, Simon Peter swore three times that he did not know you.

GOOD LORD, MAKE US FAITHFUL IN TIME OF TEMPTATION. Lord Jesus, Pilate traded you for a murderer and handed you over to crucifixion.

GOOD LORD, HAVE MERCY ON US SINNERS.

Lord Jesus, you were beaten, mocked, and humiliated by Pilate's soldiers.

GOOD LORD, MAY WE SUFFER GLADLY FOR YOUR SAKE.

Lord Jesus, on the cross you were taunted and derided as King of the Jews.

GOOD LORD, MAY WE ALWAYS LIVE IN OBEDIENCE TO YOU.

Lord Jesus, on the cross you forgave your enemies.

GOOD LORD, GIVE US THE GRACE TO FORGIVE OURS.

Lord Jesus, from the cross you promised paradise to a repentant criminal.

GOOD LORD, MAKE US LONG FOR PARADISE AND ETERNAL BLISS.

Lord Jesus, from the cross you confided your Blessed Mother to your beloved disciple.

GOOD LORD, MAKE US CHILDREN OF MARY.

Lord Jesus, you cried out in agony to your Father and died with a loud cry.

GOOD LORD, HAVE MERCY ON US, NOW AND AT THE HOUR OF OUR DEATH.

Lord Jesus, the Roman centurion recognized you as the Son of God.
