BISHOP MCKNIGHT'S MAY PRAYER INTENTION: As we honor the Mother of our Lord as the "Queen of May," may there be a greater respect and appreciation for all women on earth who nourish us in mind, body and soul.

PASTOR'S MEDITATION: 5th Sunday of Easter: GOOD-MOTHERS' DAY - BEARING WITNESS TO CHRIST

Today is Good-Mother's Day and we thank God for the good mothers, we pray for them, honor them by celebrating and by offering our good-mothers on the altar of God. This is a day to admit gratefully the fact that none of us is able to return, in the same measure, all the love that our good-mothers have given us. Their influence on us their children is so great that it affects the children throughout their lives. Our mothers not only gave us birth but nursed us, nurtured us, trained us in their religious beliefs and practices, taught us good manners and ideal behavior, disciplined us as best as they could, and made us good citizens of our country, our Church, and our society.

Hence, it is highly proper for us to express our love and gratitude to our mothers by our presence (although this year it is rendered difficult), gifts, and prayers on Mother's Day. We offer this Eucharistic celebration on Mother's Day for all the mothers in our church, whether they are alive here or have gone for their eternal reward.

The word "mom" is synonymous with sacrificial, *agápe* love in its purest form, as commanded by Jesus in his farewell speech: "*Love one another as I have loved you.*" Hence, let us lavish our love on our mothers and express our gratitude for them in the form of fervent prayers offered for them before God.

Today's readings tell us how the early Church accepted the challenge of keeping Jesus' memory alive by remaining a dynamic Christian community, bearing witness to Christ by their unity, fidelity in worship and spirit of loving, humble service. Today's Gospel introduces Jesus as the Way to God, the Truth to be accepted, and the Life to be shared and lived.

Dear friends we need to accept Jesus as the Way, the Truth, and the Life: We accept Jesus as the Way by walking his narrow way of loving, humble, sacrificial service. We accept Jesus the Truth by learning and practicing what he has taught us, as given in the scriptures and in the teachings of the Church. We share the Divine life of God through making use of the means Jesus has established in his Church: by actively participating in the Eucharistic celebration and properly receiving the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion; by the worthy reception of the other Sacraments; by the meditative and daily reading of the Word of God; by allowing the Holy Spirit living in the Church and within us to guide and strengthen us; and by communicating with God the Source of Life, in personal and family prayers. IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

We ask that St Thomas Parishioners read Bishop's McKnight's recent instruction on re-establishing Masses as the Governmental restrictions are being lifted. This letter can be found on the Church website page and on our Facebook page. Please carefully read the (Before Mass, During Mass, and After Mass) sections.

Please keep in mind that all of the faithful are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass through June 30, 2020. If you decide to attend Mass you will need to follow the strict guidelines mentioned in Bishop McKnight's letter including practicing social distancing, wearing of protective face masks or face coverings (you must provide your own) and understanding that limited seating will be available. St Thomas the Apostle will continue to live stream the Sunday 10:00 a.m. Mass for you to view. We are not encouraging you to attend. If you are uncomfortable or have concerns about attending Mass then please stay home.

Fr. Leonard, the St Thomas Parish Pastoral Council and some of the Parish staff recently met to discuss how to implement these guidelines. Below are further instructions and information for attending Mass at St. Thomas the Apostle. Should you have any questions please feel free to contact Fr. Leonard or any of the Parish Council Members.

PLEASE READ

**ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE CHURCH
INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATTENDING ALL PUBLIC MASSES
(INCLUDING WEEKDAY MASSES)**

- We are re-establishing public Mass at St. Thomas the Apostle following Diocese guidelines. Please review Bishop McKnight's instructions on the parish website under the Resources page.
- We have limited seating (50-60) available and will be first come, first served. When the capacity limit is reached, no additional parishioners will be allowed to enter church.
- If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, symptomatic or been exposed to someone with the virus with in the last 14 days – PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS
- You are required to wear a face mask or face covering when entering and exiting church and going to and from Communion. Face masks or coverings are not required to be worn when you are in the pews. When receiving Communion, pull down your mask or covering, place the Eucharist in your mouth, and immediately replace your mask or covering before returning to your pew.
- Please maintain appropriate social distancing of 6 feet. Follow floor markings when receiving Communion.
- Do not sit in pews that are roped off. Also, only the organist and cantors are allowed to be on the balcony.
- Family members may sit together.
- Place tithe/offertory in basket near center of church.
- Please refrain from using restroom if possible.
- Missals have been removed from the pews and are available on a table at the church entrance. If you want a missal, please take it home with you. Do not leave the missal in the pew. This will become your personal missal to use until after the restrictions are released.

MUSIC: Music is an integral part of worship. It is a joyous sound when the people in the congregation raise their voices together to sing their praises to God!

In the Bishop's instructions for getting cautiously together during this pandemic, the hymnals and missals, along with any other items in the pews, have been removed. Missals are on a table in the church entrance. You may pick up a missal to bring with you to public Mass **but must take it home after Mass.** Missals cannot be left in the pews. If you missed your opportunity to pick up a missal to keep with you, how am I supposed to sing, you may ask? For the immediate future, we will be using hymns that most in the congregation will likely know by heart, at least for the first verse. For others, we will use hymns with a refrain that is easy to remember, so even if you don't know the verses, you can join in on the refrain. So please, PLEASE, join in song where you can, and do the best you can. It's a brand new experience for us all. We might find singing from the heart – instead of the book – to be a very freeing experience! **--Annette Kehner**

ST. CECILIA CHURCH
INSTRUCTIONS FOR ATTENDING ALL PUBLIC MASSES

- We are re-establishing public Mass at St. Cecilia Church following Diocese guidelines. Please review Bishop McKnight's instructions on the parish website under the Resources page.
- Entrance is thru front door only. Side doors will be locked.
- We have limited seating (50-60) available and will be first come, first served. When the capacity limit is reached, no additional parishioners will be allowed to enter church.
- If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, symptomatic or been exposed to someone with the virus within the last 14 days – **PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND MASS**
- You are **required to wear a face mask or face covering** when entering and exiting church and going to and from Communion. Face masks or coverings are not required to be worn when you are in the pews. When receiving Communion, pull down your mask or covering, place the Eucharist in your mouth, and immediately replace your mask or covering before returning to your pew. Distribution of communion will be in a single row only by Fr. Leonard.
- Please **maintain appropriate social distancing of 6 feet**. Follow floor markings when receiving communion.
- Please sit in pews that are marked. Also, only the organist and cantors are allowed to be on the balcony.
- Family members may sit together.
- Place tithe/offertory in basket near entrance of church on table.
- Please refrain from using restroom if possible.
- Missals have been removed from the pews and are available on a table at the church entrance. If you want a missal, please take it home with you. Do not leave the missal in the pew. This will become your personal missal to use until after restrictions are released. Please bring back with you for the next mass.

I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, renew my heart now with the power of Your Spirit. I embrace You and unite myself wholly to You. Unite me more closely to Your Body, the Church. And never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

DIOCESE OF JEFFERSON CITY: The Diocese of Jefferson City warns the public of what appears to be an ongoing phishing scam involving emails and texts purportedly from priests or parish/Chancery staff. This scam has hit many parishes across the United States. The email or text purports to be from a person the target knows, such as one's pastor, a parish staff member, the bishop or someone else from the Church. If the target responds to the fake email or text, the sender will follow up with a request for some sort of monetary assistance, often for gift cards or ITune cards. It is truly unfortunate cyber criminals will attempt to exploit the generous nature of our community. Sending emails or texts asking for cash or gifts cards is not how priests, parishes or the Diocese of Jefferson City seeks financial assistance for our work. If you receive an email or text from a trusted church personnel asking for assistance, confirm by calling that person and do NOT respond to the email or text. St. Nick's partners with families and St. Peter Interparish School to provide this opportunity. St. Nick's is seeking Christian, married couples or single individuals who are willing to be part of a pool of relief parents. The role of relief parents is to care for the boys and home when the full-time house parents are off duty or

away. Typically, the full-time house parents are off duty every fourth weekend from 9:00 AM Friday through 7:00 PM Sunday. Relief parents, on a rotational schedule, fill in during this time. They may also be asked to be on a call list to help fill in when the house parents are on vacation and/or sick. Relief parents receive an hourly wage, all legally mandated benefits and a compensation package that includes a private suite and all meals for the days on duty. CITY OF ST. THOMAS RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS SPRING CLEAN-UP will be Wednesday, May 13. All clean up items will be picked up on the normal residential collection day. NO CAR PARTS such as tires, motor oil, batteries, etc. NO WHITE GOODS (refrigerators, stoves, hot water heaters, washing machines or dryers) NO CONCRETE or large solid items that could damage our equipment.
