**PASTORS MEDITATION: 6th Sunday of Easter C: God sometimes withdraws from us so that we can come closer.** (AA. 15:1-2, 22-29; Rev. 21:10-14, 22-23; Jn. 14:23-21) Today's readings show us the effects of the abiding presence of God in His Church and of His indwelling in each one of us. The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, tells us how the Holy Spirit, indwelling in the Church, helped the apostles to solve a major doctrinal problem about the Gentiles becoming Christians, which shook the very foundation of the early Church. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 67) prays that all the nations on the earth may recognize their God and praise Him. The second reading, taken from the Book of Revelation, describes the Church as the Heavenly Jerusalem which replaces the holy presence of God in the Holy of Holies in the Temple in Jerusalem. This New Jerusalem is a city united in love, with the victorious Jesus residing in it and in each of its members. The Gospel passage reminds us that the Holy Spirit, abiding within us, is our Teacher, our Advocate and the Source of our peace and joy. The passage offers a vision of hope as well. Jesus promises his followers that the Holy Spirit will come and instruct them in everything they need to know. **Therefore, friends** let us be aware of the abiding presence of God within us: We live in the New Covenant of Jesus, daily facing uncertainty, conflict and temptations. It is the abiding presence of God within us that enables us to face the future with undying hope and true Christian courage. The Holy Spirit Whom the risen Lord asked His Father to send upon His Church prompts us to turn to His Holy Scriptures for support and encouragement, enables us to learn the Divine truths, and grants us His peace at all times. However, to be able to receive these gifts, it is necessary for us to spend a little time each day in personal prayer, talking to God and listening to Him. We must deepen our relationship with Jesus, learn to get in touch with him, and sincerely love him. When we listen to the Holy Spirit, we will know His plan for our life and His solutions to whatever problems we face. We will be able to love our fellow human beings, and there will be a core of peace within us. The Holy Spirit teaches us through the Scriptures and preaching during the Holy Mass. Jesus loves us and comes to us in Communion. When the Mass is ended, we go forth in the peace of Christ, all this under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We need to have the conviction that we are not alone: One of the great social and ethical problems of our time is isolation. Today approximately 25% of all adults live alone. Spouses, parents, and children often live as virtual strangers to one another. This is unfortunate because we never need to be alone. Jesus can always be present to us. He shares his joy with us and replaces the burden of our guilt with the freedom of forgiveness. He takes our grief and turns it into joy. We need only allow Jesus into our lives to be rid of this loneliness. Oneness with Jesus is the greatest gift we can give our children, our friends or those who see no purpose in life. We can help to bring people into unity with Jesus, a unity that will change their lives. As we celebrate the Eucharistic meal, our Mass, let us celebrate in a special way the price Jesus paid for our redemption. May the Eucharistic celebration empower us to lead a true Life of the Spirit! **Have a blessed week! Fr. Leonard Mukiibi**

**St. Cecilia Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, May 12, 2022**

The meeting opened at 7:18 with a prayer by Fr. Leonard Mukiibi.

Those present were Betty Hagenhoff, Dorothy Rehagen, Joanne Schroeder, Debbie Hurst, Katy Werdehausen and Doris Stumpe.

Absent were Emily Libbert, Janice Schanzmeyer, and Dusty Stegeman

Minutes from the last meeting were read and had been previously approved.

**New Council Members:** Betty announced the new council members that were voted in to replace her and Dorothy are Debbie Hurst and Dusty Stegeman.

**Committee Reports**

- Cemetery-Dorothy attended the March 14<sup>th</sup> Cemetery Committee meeting. Otto Wankum was re-hired for lawn care and maintenance. Charles will be talking to John Fancher regarding graves that have sunk due to improper backfilling by the gravediggers. It was approved to change the due rates starting when a person turns 21 or have the option to pay \$300 up front. No change in assessment for the current year. Cemetery cleanup day took place on April 24<sup>th</sup>.
- Building and Grounds- JoAnn indicated there had been some shingles coming off of the church roof due to all the wind. Doris contacted Shaun with Luecke's Roofing. He will come to look at the roof on May 13<sup>th</sup>. Betty noted the grounds cleanup took place in April, and several of the Parish Council members helped out with this. Doris reported the window in the Parish Center basement was replaced by Leon Schanzmeyer and Mitch Stumpe. All thought the update looks very nice. The changing tables were also installed in the restrooms. Joanne mentioned that the white board in the Parish Center is cracked and also needs to be replaced. The group will be on the look-out for any area schools that are replacing white boards with smart boards. Father will check with St. Thomas school.
- Worship-Joann reported that the statue covers used during Lent were all marked so we know where these go next year. She also took pictures of the Easter decorations in Church for future reference. She noted a few possible areas within the Church that could use some updates or replacements. After discussion the members agreed it would be nice to have a larger table or cabinet in the back of the Church to hold parish books, pamphlets and any other items in a more organized way. All agreed the bulletin board should also be replaced as the current one doesn't hold paper and announcements well and these fly off when the doors are opened. Father mentioned it would be nice to have an area for lost and found. He mentioned the space is congested so any replacement table or cabinet would need to be small enough to fit the area. The collection baskets also need to have the lining replaced. Betty volunteered and Joann will help take on these projects later in the summer. Joanne asked about the Time and Talent forms that were completed by the parishioners. Doris will get these to the Parish Council. Doris and Joanne mentioned running out of new palms on Palm Sunday. This is because the order was based on the number from last year. Church attendance was much higher this year so additional palms will be ordered next year. Joanne has also contacted all the parents with children of serving age and will start putting them all in a rotation for Sunday Mass.
- Social Concerns-Katy will check Time and Talent forms to see if any parishioners showed interest in joining. If not, she will be contacting individuals to build this committee. Betty suggested reaching out to some that agreed to be Parish Council nominees and not voted in.
- Picnic-Dorothy reported the worklist has been prepared for printing and will be mailed again this year due to lower Mass attendance. Meals will be in to-go boxes again. Cost of meals along with beer/gin rickey will be slightly raised this year due to the rising costs. Toyland will be brought back this year for the kids. Dorothy encourages the Parish Council and any other parish members to help on the days leading up to and day after the picnic, as there is a lot of work to do on those days as well.
- Finance-Doris provided the account and CD balances as of March 31.

**Father Leonard's Report**

- Father welcomed and thanked the new council members.
- He will be attending a priest retreat from June 13<sup>th</sup> to June 18<sup>th</sup> so will be away that week.
- Father thanked the parish members who have already completed the Virtus training and will encourage all to take this.
- Father said he could complete training for any new Eucharistic Ministers who signed up on the Time and Talent forms. Doris indicated there were not any new volunteers and all that signed up have done so before.
- Father mentioned he would like the Petition readers to come up immediately after reciting the Creed. Some are coming up at slightly different times and this would keep it more consistent. For Eucharistic Ministers, he would like them to come up right after the Sign of Peace. A note will be added to the bulletin so they are all aware.
- Father noted the St. Thomas graduation will be on May 18<sup>th</sup>.
