Fr. Secrist began the meeting with a prayer.

Bill passed out an outline to update the group on the history book. We received a Congratulations document from Senator Kehoe (now Lieutenant Governor). Tom is awaiting a Congratulations document from his contact in Germany.

Bill distributed copies of some sections of the book that were recently turned in. Sheri worked on photos from the farming and agriculture section. The grouped discussed the ads turned in. Jan will send Sheri the ads so she can work on the layout of the ad section.
