PASTORS MEDITATION: 32nd Sunday in ordinary time: BE PREPARED, READY TO MEET THE LORD ANY TIME. (Wis. 6:12-16; 1Thes. 4:13-18; Mt. 25:1-13) This Sunday's readings bring the usual warnings about preparation for the end of our own world, the end of our own time, and our passage to another world. They tell us that a searching, watching, and growing heart is essential for a lively, dynamic Faith in God. They ask us whether we are ready for these events and how we are preparing for them. The first reading for today is one which personifies wisdom as a woman. The author advises Jews in Alexandria not to envy the wisdom of the pagan philosophers, because they themselves have true wisdom in their Sacred Scripture, a wisdom which regulates not only this life but the next also. Hence, they must live their lives in strict conformity with the Divine wisdom given them so generously by God. In the second reading, Paul offers Christian wisdom, assuring those Christians who expected Jesus' second coming in their lifetime that the death and Resurrection of Jesus is powerful enough to save even those who die before Jesus' second coming. But they need to be alert, well-prepared, and vigilant. The Gospel parable of the ten virgins, the foolish virgins represent the "Chosen People of God" who were waiting for the Messiah but were shut out from the messianic banquet because they were unprepared. The parable teaches us that, like the five well-prepared wise virgins, we should attend to duties of the present moment, preparing now, rather than waiting until it is too late. Therefore friends we need to be wise enough to remain ever prepared: Wise Christians find Jesus in the most ordinary experiences of daily living, in the people they meet, the events that take place, and the situations in which they find themselves, and they carefully make their daily choices for God, they are ready to put the commandment of love into practice by showing kindness, mercy, forgiveness. Let us be sure that our Lamps are ready for the end of our lives: Spiritual readiness, preparation, and growth are the result of intentional habits built into one's life. We cannot depend on a Sunday Mass or morning service alone to provide all our spiritual needs. We cannot depend on Christian fellowship alone to provide us with spiritual development. The meeting of spiritual needs and spiritual development itself come through routine, mundane attention to ordinary spiritual disciplines, making sure we have enough oil or spiritual fuel: oil of compassion and mercy, oil of patience, sympathy, and forgiveness. We open ourselves to receive these graces by taking time for prayer, and being alone with God; by reading God's Word; by living a sacramental life; by offering acts of service to others; by moral faithfulness, by loving obedience, and by spending time with other Christians for mutual prayer, study, and encouragement. When we receive the graces we need, we thank God for His generous love. When taking these ways becomes habitual, they cease to be a struggle and begin to be a source of strength and blessing. They make our lives powerful against the onslaught of the world.

St. Thomas the Apostle Parish Pastoral Council Minutes - September 26, 2023

Attended: Richard Heckemeyer, Fred Boessen, Jacob Grassle, Lynne Reinkemeyer, Linda Boessen, Carol Backes, Andrea Reynolds, Erica Loethen, Leroy Heckemeyer, and Father Leonard.
Absent: Dunja Wieberg, Shane Verslues, and Sam Luebbering
Meeting was called to order and Father Leonard led the opening prayer.
Mr. Heckemeyer provided the principal's report-

- Shared that the building was sprayed on August 10, had no more roaches for a while, and have started to notice 3-4 a day in the last week. Shane is calling pest control to come again.
- Worship committee met August 1 and have the Mass schedule set through the end of November.
There was discussion regarding hiring a youth minister and will discuss it again in November. Confirmation will be sometime after Easter. First Sunday of every month Father will celebrate anniversaries and the last Sunday of the month will be birthdays/baptism anniversaries. Next meeting is November 14 at St. Cecelia.
Social committee shared that picnic went well, did lots of business in the drive through due to the temperature, and income was down somewhat. Lynne and Linda will join Sam as PPC reps for Ham Breakfast/Picnic. Discussed if non-St. Thomas families whose children attend school at St. Thomas should be required to work the Fall Fantasy. Father noted that the expectation is that these families are participating in their home parish events/fundraisers, group did not feel that it needs to be required at this time.

Administration
-Full-time maintenance position has been filled by Keith Buechter, who is working PT right now. Will started FT at the first of the year.
-Railing at Church ramp, vitae front steps railing, and step railing from sacristy to rectory- received two bids (IEI and Charleytown Fabricators), Charleytown was low at \$6,000. The finance committee approved Charleytown. Committee curious as to start date on this project.
-Drain needs to be repaired in the water heater room by the kitchen, Shane is working on getting this taken care of.
-Mark Luebbering has fixed the countertop in the boy's restroom that is off the cafeteria as requested by the Cole County Health Department.
Finance Committee
-Approved above railing bid.
-Stewardship – Paid \$4,156 for July and \$3,792 for August to the Diocese for the 10% tithe.

-Carol attended the most recent Deanery meeting. Gave parish updates, Want Deanery parishes to help each other with plans and share ideas. How far have we made it on our Pastoral Plan? Next meeting November 7th, Carol to attend.
-Father will attend priest convocation at the Lake of the Ozarks in October.
-Have had several weddings recently and more coming up, sign of good things happening in our parish.
-Can still celebrate anniversaries/birthdays in a special way if needed.
-Father is still waiting on his papers and asked for our prayers in this.
-Parish directory- will be done by Universal Church Directories. Parish point of contact is Melissa Verslues. Pictures will be January 3-6th and will take place in the school gym.
