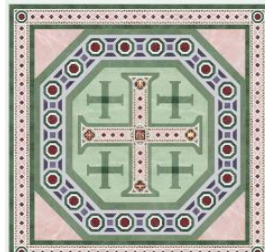

**BISHOP MCKNIGHT'S OCTOBER PRAYER INTENTION:** For our local church of the Diocese of Jefferson City; that we may become a sign and instruments in the world of the presence of Christ through our communion in charity, faith, and the Eucharist.

**PASTORS MEDITATION:** 27th Sunday in ordinary time, year B: **MARRIAGE IS FOR LIFE, MARRIAGES ARE MADE IN HEAVEN. Gen. 2:18-24; Heb. 2:9-11; Mk. 10:2-16.** Today's Scripture readings are about the bond of love that marriage creates between a man and a woman, a bond that God intends to be permanent. These readings challenge the spouses to practice the fidelity of their ever-faithful God, honoring their holy covenant commitment before Him.

The first reading, taken from Genesis explains God's original plan concerning sex and marriage. It teaches us that God made man and woman for each other. Hence, in marriage they are no longer two but one, united by an unbreakable bond. The reading also describes the institution of marriage and shows that monogamy was God's intention from the very beginning. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 128) expands the marital theme of the first reading and the Gospel to include the children born of the union. Since the children enrich the lives of their parents, the Psalmist prays: "May you see your children's children." The second reading, taken from the Letter to the Hebrews, reminds us that Jesus became one of us, bone of our bone and flesh of our flesh. As one of us, Jesus "tasted death for everyone." He was not only the Sacrifice, but also the High Priest. We are now Jesus' brothers and sisters, bonded with Him and through Him bonded with God. Thus, Christ became the Savior of all people, the good, the bad, the divorced, everyone and received all of us as brothers and sisters. Jesus' prohibition of divorce can be a source of suffering for those who face difficult married lives. Paul suggests that we have to accept pain as Jesus did, as the suffering we should endure on the way to glory. Today's Gospel gives Christ's explicit teaching on marriage and divorce, the Divine origin of marriage, the sacredness of family life and the indissolubility of marriage. These are difficult messages to preach in a society that embraces co-habitation and ignores both the escalating divorce statistics and the dangerous consequences of divorce. The Gospel teaches us that family life is sacred, that husband and wife are partners with equal rights and that the destruction of family by divorce is producing the destruction of society.

So both spouses need to work hard to create a good marriage. Marriage demands that they should become the right persons for each other as God-given gifts. Marriage is a union based on committed sharing and forgiving, sacrificial agape love. It requires

many mutual adjustments; much mutual generosity and great good will to forgive and ask for forgiveness; sincere cooperation in training children and raising them as practicing Catholic Christians and daily strength from God obtained through personal and family prayers and punctual participation in the parish liturgy.

Friends we need to reach out with Christian sympathy to the divorced and to troubled families. The parish community needs to accept them with respect, compassion, sensitivity, love and support, sharing the depth of their pain from a failed or failing marriage. The practice of the Church is that it cannot sanction a second marriage for either spouse unless the previous marriage has been declared annulled by the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal. In the meantime, "...they should be encouraged to listen to the Word of God, to attend the Sacrifice of the Mass, to persevere in prayer, to bring up their children in the Christian Faith".

**Safe Environment Instructions - For First Time Registrants - Volunteering with Minors**

Go to [www.virtusonline.org](http://www.virtusonline.org) website. Click on the "First Time Registrant" button and enter your profile information.

It is vital this information remains current, ESPECIALLY your email address. Your email address is how the system will communicate with you in the future.

Next, sign up for a Protecting God's Children workshop. This workshop may be done online or in person (if offered) and only needs to be completed one time. However, if you choose the online version, you MUST commit to the entire two hours required. If you leave the workshop prior to completion, you may have difficulty resuming.

Next, you will be prompted to read the "Code of Conduct" form (which you will sign electronically).

Within days of completing the training, the Office of Child and Youth Protection will approve your account. At this time you will receive an email from Virtus stating to log into your account to complete the background check screening process.

If you have used the site in the past and simply don't remember your information, we can help you find your information and give you a chance to update the system.

#### **St. Cecilia Parish Pastoral Council Meeting - September 9, 2021**

The meeting opened at 7:02 with a prayer by Fr. Leonard Mukiibi. Those present were Emily Libbert, Betty Hagenhoff, Fr. Leonard, JoAnn Schroeder, Katy Werdehausen, Dorothy Rehagen, Doris Stumpe. Absent was Janice Schanzmeyer. Minutes from the last meeting were read and had previously been approved.

#### **Old Business**

- Doris Stumpe reported that Mitch Stumpe will be taking care of the stump grinding that needs to be completed after the weather cools.
- Doris will also check back with the Luebbert family about a donation of a new outdoor nativity scene.
- At the last meeting, we tabled the discussion about installing a new water softener in the Parish Center. Betty mentioned if we need to update the boiler and some other things that were discovered from the recent inspection, that it might be a good time to also look into installing a water softener. It was decided we will wait to see the cost of the inspection upgrade requirements and then we will assess if it is within our budget to make all of the improvements at once. For the time being, Doris purchased a new kind of cleaner to help with the hard water issues at the Parish Center.
- Changing stations for the Parish Center are here and just need to be installed. Mitch will be getting to this soon.
- Betty suggested having a window installed in the Parish Center basement where the old fan was removed, instead of just filling it in with concrete blocks. The Parish Council agreed this was a good idea and suggested Mitch start getting quotes for the cost of having a window put in.
- Dorothy mentioned a gutter may need to be cleaned or straightened out on the corner of the Parish Center.
- JoAnn mentioned the possibility of having a cleanup day for the Parish grounds once or twice a year. The Council decided spring would be the best time.
- Betty discussed the pastoral plan that was introduced at our last meeting. The plan is designed to find ways to add life back to the church and to bring people back in. Father shared that many of the things already happening with the St. Cecilia Parish Committees are helping improve the plan and no further action was needed at this time. We will continue to find ways to seek out growing our parish. JoAnn mentioned a food or clothing drive for the upcoming holiday season. Dorothy suggested the PSR classes participate in this as well.

#### **Father Leonard's Report**

- Father thanked the committees for all of their work.
- Father talked about his upcoming vacation and how he knows things will still run smoothly while he is away.
- He also shared that he thought our Parish Council and other members of the parish are doing well to grow our Pastoral Plan.

#### **New Business**

- Doris shared for the Building and Grounds committee. Brad Copeland had come to do the insurance inspection for the diocese and discovered some things in the Parish Center that needed to be fixed including some valves needing replaced, the breaker box needing updated and it was suggested that the thermostat should be kept between 65-70 degrees in the winter to help the boiler to work properly. A few other issues were noted as well. The full written up report is supposed to be sent to Fr. Leonard soon. After the report is sent, final decisions will be made about what needs fixed immediately and what can be put off for later. Some things may need to come on the next year's budget.
- JoAnn shared that the Liturgical Committee recently met. Many upcoming dates and masses were discussed. The report from this committee will be posted separately in the bulletin. JoAnn will be updating the Time and Talent sheets and posting new ones out again in hopes to get more people involved in masses. Father has a training scheduled for servers and may be doing some training for Eucharistic ministers and lectors after he returns from his vacation. Father confirmed that offertory can once again be brought up during masses. JoAnn also mentioned getting families involved more with masses and the possibility of families taking turns and bringing up offertory again. The Parish Council members agreed this would be a good thing to try to start doing once again.
- Dorothy asked about the Virtus (Safe Environment) mandate and if there is a way for people who are unable to access a computer or the internet to do the training by alternative means, such as in person or on paper. Father will find out about this. Dorothy reminded the group that mass participants may be limited due to this new training if some people cannot access it online.
- Emily shared she has gained access to update the St. Cecilia website and that much of the information on there was outdated. She has updated several pages and the council helped with knowing other things that still need updated. Emily reminded the group that if they see things on the website that are still outdated to let her know about them and she will get it taken care of.
- One of the pages on the Parish website that is outdated is the CYO page. The group discussed that there is a need to find a new leader for this group and to attempt to get the organization started back up again within our Parish. The website will be updated seeking out someone to step into the role of the CYO leader.

The next meeting is scheduled for November 11, 2021. The meeting was closed at 8:29 with a prayer by Fr. Leonard.
