PASTOR'S MEDITATION:**27th Sunday of the year in ordinary time: "INCREASE OUR FAITH"**

It is our **SESQUICENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY** and also the world **COMMUNICATION SUNDAY** today, we pray for the means and avenues of communication especially those used to spread the gospel

As we hit the climax of our sesquicentennial, the theme of our celebration is "**increase our faith**" just as the disciples of Jesus asked him. Dear friends and parishioners of St. Thomas congratulations and happy anniversary. We thank God for this historical celebration of 150 years of existence as a Catholic faith community and for making us so special to be the ones present to host this celebration. We are lucky; God could have chosen another generation to host this celebration.

We thank God for the missionaries who brought the good news of the gospel, then our fore fathers and mothers that received the first message of the gospel in the 1800s and laid a good foundation for us and certainly our recent predecessors that have kept the gospel burning. As fire exists by burning so the church exists by mission, we are Christians today due to the missionaries who once came to the homes of our ancestors to preach the gospel, for our case **Fr. Ferdinand Helias and companions**, were it not for those poor and frequently martyred messengers of the Gospel armed only with the Lord's word, St. Thomas the apostle church and the churches in our parishes where we come to worship would not exist. Those missionaries came in the line of the disciples whom Jesus sent out "to preach the kingdom of God and to heal" (Lk. 9:2)

In our modern times a good deal of Christian mission takes place through institutions like schools (thanks be to God for St. Thomas elementary school), colleges, hospitals and welfare centers (Charities), we must regularly evaluate their effect and see whether they are truly a proclamation and witness of God's kingdom in word and deed that will last another 150 years from now, which ought to be the heart of all our missionary works.

The cross of Christ firmly roots us in human concerns and needs and it places us alongside the oppressed, the dispossessed, the homeless, the poor and the starving millions on the planet. Therefore the task of mission for today as we celebrate our 150th anniversary is not so much to get the non-Christians into the church as to get the Christians out of the church into the world, meaning it's our turn to be missionaries to be relevant for the next 150 years. **Happy Sesquicentennial Anniversary!!**
